

Program Details

The Asian Faculty Workshop (AFW) is designed for faculty members from Asia University President's Forum (AUPF) member institutions.

Each institution is invited to recommend 2–3 faculty members to participate in the workshop.

Program Cost

The participation fee for the workshop is \$520 USD, with an early bird rate of \$500 USD for registrations completed before June 15, 2025. This fee covers accommodation, meals as specified, airport transfer, workshop materials, site visits and Surabaya city tour arrangement.

Optional Tour & Extended Stay



An optional Midnight Mount Bromo tour is available for participants at a cost of USD 85. This tour offers a chance to experience the breathtaking sunrise over the Bromo Tengger Semeru National Park, explore the volcanic landscape, and visit the famous Whispering Sands.

The package includes breakfast and a horse riding experience. Participants who wish to take this optional tour are advised to bring warm/winter attire (thick jacket, gloves, and ear covers), as temperatures can be very cold in the early morning hours. The AFW 2025 Program cost covers hotel accommodation for 6 (six) nights with check-in on 14 July (Monday) and check-out on 20 July (Sunday). If you wish to join this optional tour you will need to extend your stay. Participants who wish to extend their stay or add extra nights of accommodation should contact the organizing committee in advance for arrangements.

Airport Transfer

The airport pick-up service requires participants to provide complete arrival details, including flight number, arrival time, and airline, to ensure a smooth pickup process. Airport pick-up is available on Monday, 14 July 2025, while transfers on other days are only available by prior arrangement. Upon arrival at Juanda International Airport, participants will be met at the international arrival exit, where a staff member will be holding a welcome board with their names for easy identification. Additionally, the airport transfer for departure home on Sunday, 20 July 2025, from the hotel will be arranged by the committee to facilitate participants' return journey.

You will be accommodated in a single-bed room at the hotel, with breakfast included. The program provides daily lunch at the university, while dinner will be served during the opening event on July 14, and the closing event on July 18. Additional meals will be provided during site visits and city tours. Currency: US dollars for exchange into Indonesian Rupiah (IDR) or an international credit/debit card for cash withdrawals and payments.

In a separate session, participants will share their experience with AI in learning and teaching at their respective institutions. Presentations using slides are preferred to enhance clarity and engagement.
